We did a home visit with her and helped her apply for SNAP, Senior Food Box Program, and HEAP. She has been very appreciative of the help that we have been able to provide. A few days later, she called and stated that her car had broken down and it was now in the shop. She wasn't sure how she would pay the repair bill or get to the rehab facility to visit with her husband. The Ohio Masonic Communities Resource Center reached out to Carl Keller and he provided transportation to her while her car was being repaired. The Lodge passed the hat and helped pay for her car repairs. On a separate occasion, they passed the hat at their Table Lodge for a separate donation.

It's hard asking for help! Sometimes you may need to just offer, "I'm going to contact The Ohio Masonic Communities Resource Center on your behalf and let them know you need help." 
Welcoming Rachel Lancaster



Charles Eppens, from Amelia Lodge #590, reached out to The Ohio Masonic Communities Resource Center (OMCRC) trying to find any information to help him and his family during a very stressful and difficult time. His son, Devin, had been in and out of hospitals, test after test, medication after medication. Devin was in complete kidney failure due to a rare genetic condition called Alport Syndrome. This condition attacks the kidneys, hearing, and eyes. Luckily, when Charles called OMCRC, they had found a donor for Devin and had a transplant date scheduled. Unfortunately, with all the medical complications the medical bills were adding up quickly. The Ohio Masonic Communities Resource Center was able to help the family through the Emergency Assistance Program.
